### Saturday 16th September

Anne Broome welcomed us to her studio space for our meeting and we all admired the fabulous garden, wider Dorset landscape and the peace. Neil started the proceedings with a catch up on what he has done since he was last with us in March. Neil's input via his recent work, stimulated and inspired us all. We also had gems of insight regarding how to select our work for assessment.


The first distinction Neil made regarding our submissions was between 'editing' and 'critically selecting' our work. The latter involves justifying how and why you have selected certain pieces and not others, whereas editing involves simply eliminating work without justifying it which will not engage the assessors / tutors because they cannot access your rationale.

Neil then went on to talk about his 'Dreamspace' and the importance of dreaming in his work and of reflecting on things he has not finished, or designed but not made. The dreamscape is also 'that place of not quite knowing': including in your work a level of mystery which will engage the viewer. He also told us of the importance of not being in control of your process of working all the time, of being navigated by our circumstances into different ways and paths, and of looking at obstacles and situations positively.
